A president of the United States, an NFL legend, the co-founder of Google, and an iconic pop star once criss-crossed the Diag, crammed for exams,

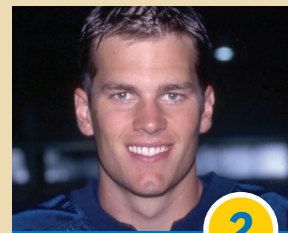
ate late-night pizza, and plotted their bright futures inside tiny Ann Arbor abodes.

Here, where they and 38 other notable U-M alumni once hung their maize and blue hats.

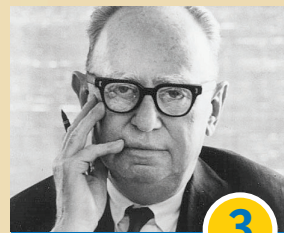
